BRAKETTES MISSION STATEMENT

We attract and recruit the finest players in the country with the objective of winning on the field of play and in our community. Through their play and community interactions, the Brakettes become role models who inspire, excite and educate young female athletes. Through their own experiences within our organization, Brakette players will themselves grow as individuals, furthering their career and education.

The Brakettes provide the opportunity for young softball players, youth groups, senior groups and disadvantaged groups to develop positive, personal relationships with the players, coaches and staff by attending games and specialized clinics.

The Brakettes are a tradition. We will uphold this tradition, established by those who've played before us, each and every day. We will honor and respect those Brakettes who have played before us.

We recognize the need to give back to the players who give so much to us; we strive to help them meet their needs, achieve their goals, and make them better players for when they return to their respective collegiate teams or pursue their careers.

WHO? – The Brakettes pride themselves on boasting a roster of the finest players in the country. They've started as young as Milford's 14-year-old Francis Spellman in 1947, to the legendary Hall of Fame pitcher Bertha Tickey, who retired at age 47 in 1967 by tossing a perfect game in her swan song.

WHAT? – The most respected, well-known, and chronicled team in the history of the sport, the Brakettes have won three World Championships (1974, 78, and 86) representing the United States and 36 national championships; they boast 23 National ASA Hall of Famers and 14 former players and managers who have participated in previous Olympic Games; they own a 72-year record of 3,895 wins against only 405 defeats to mention a few talking points. They've also raised thousands of dollars for charities; admitted youth players into home games FREE since 1988; and served as excellent role models for girls; sponsored scholarships for over two decades; and have provided thousands of fans each year with wonderful memories.

WHERE? – The Brakettes display their unbelievable talents at Frank DeLuca Hall of Fame Field in south Stratford, their home since 1988. They formerly called Raybestos Memorial Field, located next to the adjacent and long-closed Raybestos- Manhattan, Inc. brake-lining plant in mid-town from 1947-1987. Since their origin the team has played in over 50 countries and 41 states in the continental United States. They also own the world record of 168 consecutive wins from 2010 to 2012.

WHEN? – Nearly every Thursday thru Sunday, from Memorial Day until early August, culminating with the Women's Major Softball National Championship tournament, the Brakettes will be in action at DeLuca.

WHY? - Originally formed as a factory team at Raybestos-Manhattan, Inc., the Brakettes evolved into the best softball program in the world, thanks to the financial support of William S. Simpson, chairman of the board at Raybestos. His stewardship was passed onto F. Francis D'Addario of Bridgeport in 1985 before Raytech Corp. of Shelton, corporate headquarters of Raybestos in Crawfordsville, IN, stepped up from 1990-1995. Dave Carpenter of Westport then saved the team from extinction with his sponsorship through 2007 at which time Durham's Pat Sanders, President of Hypack, Inc., of Middletown and father of a collegiate softball standout, provided the major funding through 2016. In the past three years the Brakettes have relied upon their fans and friends of softball to make it happen. The 11th annual Women's Major Softball National Championship tournament will be staged July 31-August 4 at Stratford's Frank DeLuca Hall of Fame Field and the Short Beach Rec Complex. For the first time since it began in 2009, a 16-team field is anticipated, led by the defending champion Stratford Brakettes.

"Sponsoring such an event is a huge undertaking. In addition to providing rooms for the ten out-ofstate teams, the cost of umpires, awards, team social, balls and staffing makes it necessary we find a primary sponsor, or several partial sponsors for the various elements of it," said Brakettes General Manager and WMS tournament director Bob Baird.

The tournament has been a huge success since its inception. The crowds are outstanding, the teams are talented, and the games are exciting, as evidenced by the 2018 tournament when the Brakettes came out of the loser's bracket to win three straight games on the final day, including a 15-7 and 7-3 sweep over the 2017 champion St. Louis Saints to prevail.
